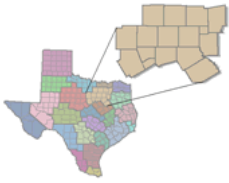

## July 2016 Data

Total Nonagricultural Wage and Employment rose for a fourth consecutive month with 23,600 jobs added in July. These additions contributed to a total job gain of 59,200 in 2016. This was slightly behind the pace of jobs added in 2015 for the same time frame of 73,400. Both the Goods Producing and Service Providing sectors grew over the month with the Service Providing sector adding 18,900 positions while the Goods Producing sector contributed 4,700 positions. Annually, Total Nonfarm employment rose by 173,000 jobs, but was short of the five year average increase of 301,100 positions. The Service Providing sector provided the lift behind a Total Nonfarm annual increase with 235,000 jobs added, while the Goods Producing sector lost 62,000 positions and fell annually for 15 consecutive months. The annual growth rate for Total Nonfarm remained at 1.5 percent and has not changed in three consecutive months.

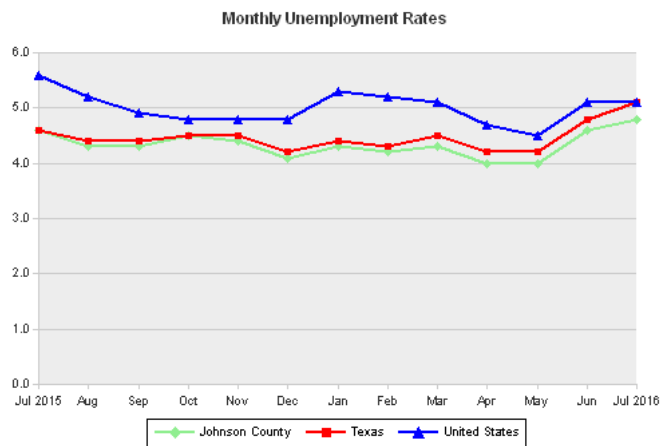

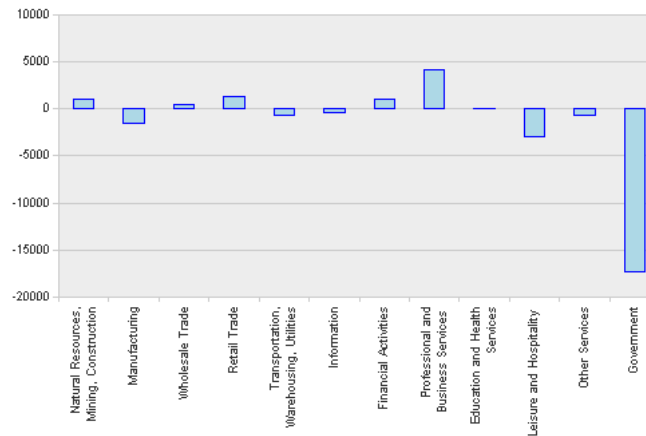
